Warm-up Information

Warm-up will follow Swim England protocols:

- Warm-up split into two equal blocks per session.
- **No diving**, except in designated sprint lanes at the end of each block.
- Odd lanes: clockwise / Even lanes: anticlockwise
- Swimmers must exit via the **side of the pool**, never over the timing pads.
- Lane usage governed by coaches.

Due to the number of swimmers in different age groups we have allocated club lanes for each warm-up. Coaches can decide how they wish to use them.

Coaches & Team Managers

- Coaches' passes are £15 per day must be ordered in advance
- No entry to poolside without a valid pass.
- Passes must be worn visibly at all times.

Poolside Conduct

- No large bags on poolside, there are lockers available for use in the changing village.
- No fold-up or camping chairs on poolside.

Changing Rooms

• **No mobile phones** in changing rooms (strictly enforced). We respectfully ask all clubs to communicate this prior to the event will all attending swimmers and travelling volunteers.



Race Marshalling

• It is the responsibility of the coaches, team managers and swimmers to ensure that they attend marshalling at the appropriate time for their races. We will not be able to fit anyone in that misses a race unfortunately.

- Under 16s: Free
- Gallery opens at 12:30.
- We will be holding a raffle at the door entry point this will also be card only and be drawn at the start of the second session.

Alan Canham 1940 - 2024

When he was 32, Alan moved his family from Enfield to North Weald. It was at this point that he switched from Broomfield Park SC to Harlow – Swimming and Diving Club, as it was then known. Alan dedicated his life to swimming: as a club swimmer, he competed against Ian MacKenzie for the Essex County Breaststroke records. Until very recently they both still held some of the event best times. Alan remained a Masters competitor to the end. He set the over 70s Essex 50m Breaststroke record. Alan was also a life-long volunteer – as a swimming coach; and also as a financial advisor to several large charities. Alan taught 4 generations of swimmers. He was a specialist Breaststroke coach and produced National Breaststroke competitors at Harlow in each of these generations: Alfie Blohm, Karl Batorski, Mason Arnold.

Essex County ASA awarded Alan a Silver Pin for over 15 years voluntary service to swimming. He had an especially effective way with children and new swimmers. So much so that many people (including Rod Stewart) always wanted to pay him for private lessons; but he would never take any money – he preferred to work at the Club where he could be most effective to more swimmers. He was loved and respected by all coaches, parents and swimmers. Vikki Tee, one of several swimmers he taught who became a level 3 coach was inspired to put his name forward for the Queen's Honours List. Ironically, having just had a stroke, Alan did not qualify as "still volunteering in the role", although as soon as he was able, Alan was back in the water and though he never fully regained speech, he still tried to teach children through gesture.

We will all remember Alan's many techniques and ways to describe swimming movements – as well as his jokes, and the way he would tell the same story over to each person he met in the morning. He was totally reliable. You could hear his BMW 3 Series classic as it pulled into the pool car park and know that you would never be walking onto poolside alone.

Alan Canham was an institution at Harlow swimming club and will be greatly missed.

The club has named it's December Open Meet the "Alan Canham Age Group Qualifier" as a fitting tribute – since achieving County Age Group times is a first sign of success for a competitive swimmer.
