

What does KASC offer?

KASC is a family-oriented club with over a century of history behind us.

We are a SwimMark accredited club.

We have a highly qualified team of coaches and poolside helpers to help every child reach their potential.

We run a number of squads, ranging from our academy and junior squads, which follow the Swim England 'Learn to Swim' framework, through to our junior and senior competitive squads and also a masters squad. More information about the squads and the criteria for each squad can be found on our website under the Squads tab.

Training sessions take place at 3 pools; our primary training base is Kettering pool but we also have sessions at Thrapston pool and Oundle School pool depending on the squad a swimmer is in. The training schedule is also on our website under the Squads tab and on page 11.

We compete in a number of leagues including the Leicester Autumn and Winter Leagues and

Leicester Diddy League. We also compete in Northamptonshire county galas, county championships and development galas. Our swimmers also have the opportunity to represent the club at open meets and at regional and national championships.

We run our own annual Club Championships where medals and trophies can be won.

We also have a programme of 'in club' galas for younger swimmers to gain times and experience of racing. For more information about competitions, please refer to page 6.

From time to time we hold 'Dash Nights' at which members of the competitive squads are invited to race and times are recorded to mark the swimmers' progress.

Our Water Polo team train at Kettering Swimming Pool on a Thursday evening and compete in a regional league. For more details about Water Polo please visit our website or contact waterpolo@kasc.org.uk.

Although we have a busy schedule of competitions throughout the year, we do find time to socialise! We hold an annual award night where trophies are presented to swimmers to mark their achievements at the club championships and throughout the year.

All of our club news and updates, including competition results and upcoming events can be found on our website, www.kasc.org.uk, where swimmers and parents can also access their account.

There is also an app called 'On Deck' where you can access information and your account from your smartphone, although there is much more information on the website.

You can keep up to date with our news and announcements on social media. We have a public Facebook group, Kettering Swimming Club, and a members' only Facebook group, Kettering Amateur Swimming Club Kettering.



Galas and competitions

Kettering Amateur Swimming Club is a competitive club and as a team we compete in many different competitions throughout the year and we encourage all of our swimmers to take part in the appropriate galas and open meets.

Galas

Your child may be selected to represent the team at galas and they should be encouraged to take the opportunity to swim for the team if selected to do so.

As well as a number of county galas, we also compete in the Leicester & District Swimming League which holds three competitions a year - Autumn League (all age groups), running in October, November and December, Winter League (all age groups), running in January, February and March, and Diddy League (under 12s), running in April, May and June. At each of these competitions there are 3 rounds and the galas normally take place on Saturday evenings. The gala dates are available on the fixture list on the website. As part of the Leicester League it means that galas are held at different venues across Leicestershire and the surrounding area, often at pools such as Hinckley, Braunstone and Rugby, although sometimes closer to home at Corby or Market Harborough. If your child is selected for the team it is because they have achieved good times and their coaches and the team manager feel they deserve a place so it is important for your child's development that they attend whenever possible. Team galas are a fantastic way to learn about competitive swimming, gain new times and are always a lot of fun for the swimmers. If you have any questions about galas and competitions, please speak to one of the coaches, committee members or poolside volunteers.

Club Championships

Our club championships, usually held in October and November, is open to all of our swimmers (as long as they have registered as members of the club by the end of the preceding August). Swimmers have the opportunity to enter events in all four strokes plus the individual medleys across distances from 25m to 400m. Swimmers compete against club mates in the same age group for medals, with trophies available for overall achievements in each age group across the whole competition which are presented at the annual awards night. Details about club

championships are circulated to all members in the summer and the coaches and committee members will be able to provide further information and answer any questions.

Open Meets

The club also enters numerous open meets throughout the year. Swimmers have to achieve minimum entry times to enter events and there is a charge payable for each event entered. Some open meets will be aimed at developing swimmers and will have easier entry times whilst some meets at higher levels will be targeted by more experienced competitive swimmers and will have tougher entry times. Meets may be run in a 25 metre (short course) or a 50 metre (long course) pool and may be at local pools such as Corby or Rugby, or may be further afield such as Sheffield. Open meets may be a single day (or part of a day) or may run over a whole weekend. Details about individual meets will be circulated to all members. Entry is normally via our website and it is important that entries and payments are received before the deadline stated (sometimes these are very short deadlines as very popular meets will fill up quickly). If you are ever unsure whether a particular meet is appropriate, or if you would like more information about open meets, please discuss with the squad coach. Swimmers must be Club Compete members to take part in these competitions.

County and Regional Championships

We compete as a club at the Northamptonshire ASA County Championships against the other county clubs. The championships are held annually in January and February. The competition is held at Corby East Midlands International Pool in the 50 metre pool, over four separate weekends and includes events in all strokes across all distances as well as team relays. Any swimmer who will be aged 10 or over by the end of the year of the competition will be eligible to enter if they have achieved the qualifying times. Our club championships provides an excellent opportunity for swimmers to gain county qualifying times.

We also compete at the Northamptonshire ASA county sprints competition which is usually held at Corby in the 25 metre pool, in September over one afternoon. Swimmers can compete in each of the four strokes over 50 metres and the 100m individual medley, and may be selected for team relays.

Northamptonshire ASA is part of the Swim England East Midlands region. The East Midlands regional championships is usually held in April and May and can be entered by swimmers who meet the qualifying times. Qualifying times are much tougher and must be achieved under certain conditions within a specified time frame. County Sprints, County Championships and open meets provide opportunities for swimmers to qualify for regional championships.

The times that swimmers achieve at open meets and at county and regional championships are recorded on the Swim England national rankings database (www.swimming.org.uk). The highest ranked swimmers in the country are invited to compete at the National Championships which take place in the summer.

There is always something for our swimmers to aim for!

Governance

KASC has a committee that ensures the smooth running of the club. The committee meets once a month and we hold an AGM in November. The current members of the committee can be found on page 15.

The club constitution and policy documents can all be found on the website under the documents tab.

We are a SwimMark club. SwimMark accreditation is Swim England's quality standard for clubs, recognising high standards of governance, sustainability and effectiveness.

Volunteers

Like all clubs, we rely on volunteers to ensure that our club runs successfully. If you are interested in helping with any aspects of the club, then please speak to our volunteer coordinator, a committee member or one of the coaches. This could involve becoming a committee member, helping on poolside, becoming an official, being on the social committee, helping at events or just providing cakes or raffle prizes for events. Job descriptions are available and relevant training for different roles can be provided or organised. There is a section about volunteering on the club website.

Communication

Our main form of communication is by email so it is vital that email addresses are kept up to date on your account. General communication will be via email, on our website and on social media (see page 5).

There may be times when we need to contact swimmers and/or parents by phone so please ensure that contact information is kept up to date.

Swim England Code of Ethics



Terms of Reference

The content of this Code of Ethics applies to all those involved within the sport of Swimming, Diving, Water Polo, Open Water Swimming and Synchronised Swimming. The Code of Ethics should be read in conjunction with the ASA Codes of Conduct contained in Wavepower (ASA Child Safeguarding Policy and Procedures).

Swim England Code of Ethics

All individuals within the Swim England aquatic disciplines will at all times:

- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person, be they adult or child, treating everyone equally within the context of the sport.
- Respect the spirit of the sport adhering to the rules and laws in and out of the pool, incorporating the concept of friendship and respect for others.
- Promote the positive aspects of the sport and never condone the use of inappropriate or abusive language, inappropriate relationships, bullying, harassment, discrimination or physical violence.
- Accept responsibility for their own behaviour and encourage and guide all Swim England members and parents of junior members to accept responsibility for their own behaviour and conduct.
- Ensure all concerns of a child safeguarding nature are referred in accordance with Wavepower (Swim England ((ASA) Child Safeguarding Policy and Procedures).
- Conduct themselves in a manner that takes all reasonable measures to protect their own safety and the safety of others.
- Promote the reputation of the sport and never behave or encourage or condone others to behave in a manner that is liable to bring the sport into disrepute.
- Adhere to Wavepower the Swim England Child Safeguarding Policy and Procedures.
- Adhere to the Swim England Anti-Doping Rules.
- Adhere to the Swim England Equity Policy.
- Adhere to the Swim England Laws and Regulations.
- Adhere to the Swim England Codes of Conduct.


