Alastair Kershaw Head Coach Report

Hi Everyone,

It's been a full on but successful 2 months since the last Newsletter.

Starting with a busy (very very busy!) NUEL SC Early County Qualifier Open Meet, it was fantastic to see so many of our swimmers entered. Everyone really set a marker for the rest of the season and it was great to see this followed up by another round of fantastic results at the Essex Winter Champs just a week later.

Essex Winter Champs

Congratulations and well done to all of our Winter County Champs swimmers, who earlier this month raced across two days at the LAC. We had a number of Winter County champions across multiple events, along with even more medalists, even more finalists and a number of younger first time qualifiers to this Senior focused Championships.

Raheel, Margarita and Kameliya all came away with Championship cups, the awards given to the winners of the Senior/Open age group. Raheel came away with the 400 IM, 200 IM and 200 Butterfly cups, Magi with the 100 IM, 200 IM and 100 backstroke cups and Kameliya with the 100 and 200 breaststroke cups. Raheel and Magi also came away with silver and bronze medals in multiple events.

Jason also finished top of the para swimming category in multiple events including 200 freestyle and 400 IM as well as earning medals as an able bodied swimmer, which is a huge achievement.

Oliver, Azzurra, Ryan and Oscar also claimed individual silver/bronze medals.

We had a number of successful relay teams over the weekend as well, with the Boys A team finishing 3rd in both the 4x50 freestyle and medley relays and the girls swam fantastically to claim a silver medal in the 4x50 medley relay. A big well done also to our Boys B and C teams, with the B team also finishing inside the top 10.

It was fantastic to see that this year we had a much broader range of ages and events entered for this Champs, showing that we are steadily growing in depth across all ages and disciplines.

This year as a team we finished 5th in the points standing, a huge improvement from last year and 2023, where we finished 11th in the County.





London Winter Champs

At the start of November we had London Winter Regional Champs. With a bigger group of swimmers qualifying this year, we had a great weekend of racing with lots of PBs smashed and some fantastic process focused swims. Magi, Jason and Kam all came away as Regional Champions. Jason set a new British Para Record (breaking his own!) in the 200 butterfly in the S14 Classification, breaking the 2.10 barrier for the first time. Kam broke the Bulgarian National Record in the 200 breaststroke with a fantastic swim, taking down a record that had stood for almost 40 years!

Mark, Bariş and Azzurra all also qualified for A & B finals across the weekend. Overall it was a brilliant weekend of racing, stepping it up another level from Essex Winters only 2 weeks earlier. Well done everyone!

Swim England National Winter Champs

Next week Magi, Jason, Bariş and Raheel all travel to Sheffield for English National Winter Champs. With all 4 of them swimming multiple events it'll be a busy 4 days of racing with all of them looking to finish short course season on a high!

Good luck to all of them!

Overseas Representation

Magi and Kam both travelled to Bulgaria 2 weeks ago for Bulgarian Short Course Nationals. Both Magi and Kim came away as multiple Bulgarian National Champions as well as a further haul of silvers and bronzes from the weekend, included in which is relay success!

Lastly, well done to everyone for making this year such a success. It's been such a pleasure to see the big steps we've made as a Club this year, with improved representation from Counties right the way up to international representation!

And thank you to Michael and the Committee for working tirelessly behind the scenes to ensure we all have a swimming club to be part of and be proud of!!

Where do I start? What a year it has been, let's start with one of the programs I am most proud of...

Time Trials

Last season, our Time Trials programme ran across five full events, and we have already completed two rounds in the 2025/26 season. What a brilliant start it has been. We began last year with lower numbers (60-70 swimmers) and finished strongly, and this season has continued that upward trend with 128 swimmers taking part in Round 1 and Round 2 having 125 swimmers - an incredible turnout.

The quality of swimming has been just as impressive. We saw a huge number of personal bests, along with many swimmers taking on their first official races. It was especially encouraging to see our newest Bronze and Silver swimmers stepping up to compete so early in their journey. Several young swimmers even tackled the 100 IM as their first official licensed race - a challenging event and a fantastic achievement.

Our older swimmers used the Time Trials as valuable preparation for the competitive season, practising race strategies and sharpening their skills ahead of Counties. A major development this year is that all our Time Trials are now fully licensed, meaning every swim counts towards ASA rankings and can be used for County qualification. This is a huge step forward for the club and for the progression of our athletes.

Of course, none of this would be possible without our volunteers. A special thank you to Michael and Yukie, whose work behind the scenes is the reason these events run so smoothly. I loved Club Champs as a swimmer, and it's incredibly rewarding to be experiencing it all over again from the organising side. Although I've been less hands-on this year while learning the AOE Timing Suite, I'm grateful to everyone who has stepped up to support the programme.

We are, however, in need of more officials. I encourage parents - especially those of our younger swimmers - to get involved. If you're interested (or even if you're not but think you can help... do me a favour :)), please reach out. Your support makes all the difference.

LAC Network

The Network Swimming programme has been another positive part of our season. For those unfamiliar, Network provides our young swimmers with the opportunity to - quite literally - 'network'.

NUEL swimmers train alongside athletes from other clubs, taking part in a combined land session and a coached pool session. The programme is led by Ron Philpot and our very own Rosa Gallop, and continues to offer valuable development and variety for swimmers in the early stages of the pathway.

Attendance has been steady, but we would love to see more of our Platinum and Gold swimmers taking advantage of the opportunity. The environment, coaching exposure, and training variation make it an excellent tool for long-term development, and I strongly encourage eligible swimmers to attend when sessions are offered.

Restructure

This year's restructure has been a significant success. We implemented a complete redesign of the bottom end of the pathway, allowing us to cater for a wider range of swimmers and better support engagement and longevity within the sport. The results have been clear: attendance across squads has been consistently strong, and the cultural shift has been evident on poolside.

We are now seeing real commitment from swimmers at the earliest stages of their journey. As this continues, the benefits will show not just in performance, but in confidence, resilience, and enjoyment - qualities that stay with swimmers for life. The restructure has strengthened the club's pathway, improved squad balance, and created an environment in which both swimmers and coaches can thrive.

To finish, I would like to thank Michael, who has been a real mentor for me on and off poolside, the committee, our parents, and of course our swimmers for making this role such an enjoyable one - it never feels like a job when you're surrounded by a community like this. I'm looking forward to everything the next year has in store for NUEL.


MASTERS
