Following the Summer break athletes have been preparing to attend grade exams in September.

OWASC is due to start sessions mid-September in a new Oxford base, Marston Ferry Pool, as sadly the pool closure at Harcourt Hill went ahead on September 1st.

The GB Olympic duet of Izzy Thorpe and Kate Shortman, from Bristol, made artistic swimming history with two base mark free routine swims to gain GB's first ever Olympic medal (Silver). Having watched Izzy and Kate in competition since they were 11 years old, it was wonderful and emotional to see them achieve success at this level after all their years of hard work and dedication to the sport.

There have been numerous enquiries concerning new starter sessions at OWASC following the coverage of Artistic Swimming at the Olympic Games and the GB success. Hopefully this interest will continue to help our sport to grow.

ONB Disabilities Report September 2024

A very busy summer for the para swimmers

At the end of July we had the British Summer Championships which saw 2 ONB Para swimmers take part on a multi classification basis. Olivia Newman-Baronius (Maxwell), straight from a heavy training camp with Aquatics GB, competed in an extremely busy programme consisting of 200fc 1st, 100fly 3rd, 100bc 3rd, 200IM 5th, 100br 7th and a heats only swim of the 100fc (as an S14 this was just for selection purposes for the Paris relay team). Amanda Readhead (Maxwell) also competed in 50fc 15th.

The following week saw the Swim England Summer Championships which again saw 2 ONB Para swimmers take part. Amanda competed in a busy programme of 100fc 5th, 100br 3rd, 200IM 4th, 400fc 5th, and 50fly 1st. Gavina Semonella (Wantage) swimming in her first Summer Nationals acquitted herself well securing 100br 4th.

The main event of the summer for Olivia N-B has been the Paralympics. After a rollercoaster of a year Olivia has had the incredible opportunity to compete for GB in her first Paralympics. She has acquitted herself very well having been given the busiest programme of any swimmer on the GB team. Olivia swam in every event available to an S14 swimmer, making the final in everyone, including the mixed relay, in which she achieved a GOLD medal!

Individually she came agonisingly close to the medals with 4th places in 100fly and 200fc, 6th in the 200IM and 8th in the 100br. As I am writing this, and pausing to watch her final swim in the 100bc she has just achieved BRONZE, her first individual Paralympic medal! Huge congratulations Olivia, we are all incredibly proud of you and know that this is just the beginning of your swimming career.

For swimmers with a physical disability to begin the process of becoming classified they need to attend a Regional Para Development day to get their skills signed off, this then allows them to be placed on the waiting list for classification. Regional Para Development days are open to any swimmer with a physical, visual, intellectual or hearing impairment. The most recent event was held in June. I will forward the information for the next event as soon as it becomes available.

If you have any swimmers who require visual/intellectual classification please contact me if you need advice/assistance. Also please let me know if any of your swimmers obtain a classification so that I can ensure they receive any appropriate meet/development opportunity information.

The next regional development meet for Para swimming is taking place on Sunday 22nd September at Hengrove Pool in Bristol. This is a joint venture between SER and SWR. The development meets are a good opportunity for our up and coming para swimmers to test themselves against others with similar disabilities and are an enjoyable early stage meet. I believe we have a few swimmers taking part and I will report back at the next meeting as to how everyone gets on. The para qualification times for winter regionals are now available on the SER website as the next level of competition for Para swimmers to aim at. Followed by the winter Para Nationals, full details of which I will distribute when they become available, but for your diaries the dates are 23rd/24th November and venue is Sandwell. There will also be opportunities to swim in the Winter Short Course Nationals details of criteria for Para swimmers should be released at the same time as the full conditions.

National Masters Intercounty Championships, London Aquatics Centre, 10 November

It has been confirmed that the South East gala of the Intercounty competition will again be held at the London Aquatics Centre on Sunday 10 November (1-4.30pm). The five regional galas are held concurrently and results amalgamated to give the overall national result; last year ONB finished 11th nationally which was our best result for a number of years.

Over the summer I have contacted ONB clubs to ask for names of Masters and Senior swimmers who would wish to put themselves forward for the ONB team this year, however please also contact me at onbmasters@gmail.com with any swimmers' names and ages - all events are 50m and in 10 year age bands (18+, 25+, 35+, 45+, 55+ and 65+).

All swimmers are very welcome to put themselves forward for the team and I would very interested in hearing from any 65+ swimmers as well as any Senior (18-24 year old) swimmers, especially from clubs that do not have an active Masters squad.

I am also struggling to find someone to fill the lead referee role for this gala. This role rotates between the SER counties and this year is ONB's turn; if you are an official who would be willing to support the county Masters team by taking on the lead referee role, please drop me a line at onbmasters@gmail.com.

Judicial Regulations

Swim England has published updated regulations which aim to reduce the workload on club officials and volunteers by offering increased structure and support when dealing with complaints or safeguarding concerns.

The revised Judicial and Safeguarding Regulations came into effect on Tuesday 3 September 2024 and aim to ensure a fairer process for all involved.

They have been updated as part of the next phase of work following recommendations contained in the Weston Report, which was published in March, and findings from the Listening Report.

The regulations cover, among other things, club complaints, safeguarding, judicial complaints, a new role of Swim England disciplinary officer and complaints made during water polo matches.
