A special mention also goes to Sean McKenny and Eloise Perry who withdrew from the Skins after qualifying in this age group.

Edison Lorejo won the 14 years and under boys' category with a stunning final 50m butterfly race against Corey Huckstep from Boyton End and Isabelle Moore just beat Kiera Broad in a 50m backstroke head-to-head in the girls' 14 years and under category.
