Thirteen West Suffolk swimmers travelled to Luton last weekend (5 to 6 November) to compete against the fastest swimmers from across Norfolk, Suffolk, Cambridgeshire, Essex, Bedfordshire and Hertfordshire at the Swim England East Region Short Course Championships in Luton.

Having worked hard to achieve the challenging qualifying times to compete, the swimmers — drawn from training centres in Haverhill, Bury St Edmunds and Culford — posted some outstanding personal best times over the course of the weekend. Elizabeth Wright, 15, a pupil at Castle Manor School posted PBs in the 200m and 50m breaststroke events and as did Edward Merhan, from Haverhill, in the 50m and 100m breaststroke events.
