## SAFEGUARDING IS EVERYONE'S RESPONSIBILITY – IF YOU NOTICE SOMETHING – REPORT IT!

If you have a concern about the welfare of any child or the behaviour of an adult towards any child you should, without delay, contact:

If you believe a child has been harmed or may be at immediate risk of harm, and you are unable to contact your welfare officer or the Swim England safeguarding team please make immediate contact with an appropriate agency, such as:

- The Police 999 Phone 999 if a crime is being committed or if a child is in immediate danger
- The Police 101 Contact Derbyshire police on 101 if you think a crime has been committed but there is no immediate danger
- Derbyshire's Starting Point 01629 533190 contact Starting Point if you think a child is being neglected, physically abused, sexually abused and your concern is urgent
- Derbyshire County Council LADO (Local Authority Designated Officer) 01629 533190 if you are concerned that someone in a position of trust has harmed a child or behaved in a way that indicates that they may be unsuitable to be in a position of trust, please contact the LADO to discuss your concerns promptly, before speaking to the person of concern

Take the name and contact details of the person you have spoken to, plus the incident / referral reference number (if applicable) so you have a record of the advice they give.

Report this to the Club Welfare Officer and/or the Swim England safeguarding team the next working day.
